

2019 Glassblowing Mentorship Grades 9-11

The glass artists of First City Art Center are proud to be offering free comprehensive glassblowing instruction to 4 high school students 9th – 11th grade in Escambia and Santa Rosa County. This year's program, our ninth, will begin with an orientation on Feb. 19th and will continue Tuesdays and Saturdays until April 6th (see schedule below) Application deadline: Jan. 25th. Selections will be announced Feb. 11th.

Student requirements:

Attend the 2-hour orientation (Feb. 19th evening) with parents. We will discuss our expectations for the course as well as expose the students and parents to some of the glass blowing process.

After orientation students are expected to attend each scheduled session. If the student is unable to attend we will expect some notification so the session can be rescheduled.

Tuesday studio session will be from 5:45 p.m. to approximately 9:00 p.m.

Saturday studio session will be from 2:00 p.m. to approximately 5:00 p.m.

No class March 16th. In place of the regular class, students will assist with glass demonstrations 5-6 p.m. at Hot Glass Cold Brew, on March 15th. Parents please attend.

All classes will be held at First City Art Center. Students will be responsible for obtaining their own transportation to and from First City Art Center.

Students will be expected to participate in studio set-up and clean-up.

Class will not be held the week of Spring Break. Students will have the opportunity to attend open studio this week.

Glassblowing has some inherent dangers. These dangers will be discussed in detail at our orientation session. Students should be prepared to experience some extreme temperatures and bring water and snacks for each session.

Each student and parent will be required to sign the Hold Harmless Agreement.

Fee:

This 6-week instruction is being provided free of charge by various donors and the artists of the Glass Guild. The approximate value for each student is over \$1000 and is why we carefully screen for the truly motivated students who will benefit most. Students will be provided with all tools and color during the program, and will be instructed by volunteers from the First City Glass Guild.

Selection Process:

Each interested student must complete the short application detailing their current interest in art and why they are interested in pursuing this opportunity in glassblowing. Each student application must also include a written recommendation by a high school teacher. Students may also submit photos of recent art/craft works. Selection is at the sole discretion of the First City Art Center Glass Guild instructors. Short interviews will be conducted February 6th - 8th.
